Boyce Park is host to the 7th Annual Monroeville Jazz Festival on the 18th.

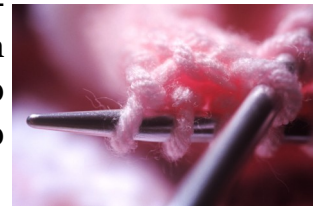
Scrap-All-Nite
