PA Senate calls for 50% reduction in Funding for Libraries in the State Budget In response to Governor Rendell's proposed 2009-2010 budget cuts, the Pennsylvania Senate plans to cut funding for public libraries across the Commonwealth by 50%! If this proposal passes library facilities, hours, services, programming, materials and personnel will be drastically affected. Contact your Elected Officials and tell them NO to library funding cuts!
